## using the grid method to copy or scale-up an ímage.

You wíll need: Paper, pencíl and ruler.

1. Select your ímage
2. Gríd up a COPY of your ímage.

3. You could use a numbering system to help you find each square if you wish

4. Now just start sketching WHAT YOU SEE in each square.

5. Grid up your paper with the same amount of squares. The same size or larger depending on the scale your final image will be.

Tips: Don't press too hard when drawing your grid on your paper. You must be able to rub it out!
Leave a small boarder around your page.

You could use acetate as a permenent grid and use this for stíll lives as well.

## Grid method exercises.

A more traditional way of copying your photo would be to divide it up into squares or rectangles and just scaling it up from there. Viewing each block as a separate sketch makes the task much easier to complete.
